



**FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION  
ILLINOIS PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD**

The parties of record before the Property Tax Appeal Board are TIAA of America, the appellant, by attorney Huan Cassioppi Tran, of Flanagan/Bilton, LLC, in Chicago; the Cook County Board of Review; Leyden Comm. HSD No. 212 and Rhodes School Dist. No. 84 1/2, intervenors, by attorney Ares G. Dalianis of Franczek Radelet P.C. in Chicago; and Veterans Park District, intervenor, by attorney Matthew G. Holmes of Storino, Ramello & Durkin, in Rosemont.

Prior to the hearing, the appellant, the board of review, and intervenors, Leyden Comm. HSD No. 212 and Rhodes School Dist. No. 84 1/2, reached an agreement as to the correct assessment of the subject property. Veterans Park District, another intervenor, adopted the evidence submitted by the board of review. Pursuant the Board's rules, an intervenor shall be precluded from withholding authorization for settlement of the appeal and the adopting party shall be bound by the terms of the stipulation and agreement. (See 86 Ill. Adm. Code §1910.99(a)). The aforementioned assessment agreement was presented to and considered by the Property Tax Appeal Board.

After reviewing the record and considering the evidence submitted, the Property Tax Appeal Board finds that it has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this Cook County appeal. The Property Tax Appeal Board further finds that the agreement of the parties is proper, and the correct assessed valuation of the property is:

**IMPORTANT NOTICE**

Section 16-185 of the Property Tax Code provides in part:

"If the Property Tax Appeal Board renders a decision lowering the assessment of a particular parcel after the deadline for filing complaints with the Board of Review or after adjournment of the

session of the Board of Review at which assessments for the subsequent year are being considered, the taxpayer may, within 30 days after the date of written notice of the Property Tax Appeal Board's decision, appeal the assessment for the subsequent year directly to the Property Tax Appeal Board."

In order to comply with the above provision, YOU MUST FILE A PETITION AND EVIDENCE WITH THE PROPERTY TAX APPEAL BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED DECISION IN ORDER TO APPEAL THE ASSESSMENT OF THE PROPERTY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR.

Based upon the issuance of a lowered assessment by the Property Tax Appeal Board, the refund of paid property taxes is the responsibility of your County Treasurer. Please contact that office with any questions you may have regarding the refund of paid property taxes.
